Organ Sales

The suggestion by Robert Berman of the Halakhic Organ Donor Society (Back Page, Oct. 17) to legalize the sale of organs reminded me of two other modes of selling one's body: slavery and prostitution. In fact, many of his arguments could equally apply to both of those as well. He says that there is an illegal trade in organs anyway, something that is equally true for slavery and prostitution. He claims that legalizing organ sales will make it safer; one can use the same argument for almost everything illegal, including prostitution and drugs.

Berman further argues that we can help poor people provide for their families by letting them sell their organs. I think that it is safe to say that poverty is the source for a good deal of the reasons for slavery and prostitution as well. Finally, he makes the absurd comparison with selling one's hair

and sperm, and reasons that if we allow those, selling organs is no different. But hair grows back and the human body produces millions of sperm cells, which can hardly be said for one's kidneys.
